Dynamite blasting cap accidents suffered by children in-crease every year during the summar vacation period, Chief of Police John H. Stroh warned this week. Children or adults finding a blasting cap were warned by Chief Stroh to leave it alone and report it immediately to the police department or sheriff's of 4

The same goes for war sou works," Stroh warned. "Old lock thus reducing the chances bullets, shells, flares and the like make poor playthings,"he spid.
