Employment In Area Up During Past Month

Employment in the Torrance area hit a new high for 1950 during the past month, according to a report released this week by Winona Ellis, manager of the Torrance branch of the California Department of Employment.

Reporting on the number of unemployed persons seeking work through the Torrance office, Miss Ellis' announcement shows that more than 100 fewer persons are now seeking employment than sought it one month ago.

The rise in employment is reflected in each of the seven classifications set up by the employment office.

Largest change was in the general labor classification. Figures for May indicated that 150 persons were seeking such work, while the figures released this week show that only 110 are now seeking work.

The number of persons registering for work with the local office in other classifications has likewise decreased, Miss Ellis reports.

leave demand is likewise double that now granted municipal employees.

Following the reading of the union's letter, the council delegated Stevens to meet with the negotiating committee to arrange a meeting with the council.

In addition to the pay raise the union will ask the city to grant vacations of three weeks (15 working days) with pay, allowance of one day accumulative sick leave per month up to sixty days, decrease 11 holidays, no-work days plus giving days off on all state election days.

The city will be asked also to give employees another day off when their regular day off falls on a holiday and that Monday be declared a holiday when the regular holiday falls on a Sunday.

They will ask that all regular employees be guaranteed a 40-hour pay check each week.

Members of the negotiating committee are Sherman Miller, John G. Cox, Sam F. Webb, Roy Winters and W. S. Camp.

est at the officials of 15 precincts wherein count discrepancies were noted and on the shoulders of City Clerk A. H. Bartlett into whose care the ballots were tendered after the election.

Largest errors found during the three-day recount, were discovered in precincts No. 7 and No. 21. In these two precincts

errors believed to have occurred in transcribing the original election board tally were corrected—giving Blount 15 additional votes. In the first case, believed to be a transposition, Benstead was credited with 98 votes on the tally sheet. The recount showed only 89 votes in his favor. In precinct No. 21 the figure 51 was recorded as 57 for Benstead.

Correction of these errors and others made in the favor of both candidates gave Blount a final 17-vote lead.

During the recount the original count of 15 precincts of the city's 80 precincts held as tallied. No errors were found in precincts 1, 2, 3, 6, 10, 11, 15, 17, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, and 30.

O'Hara May Be Unopposed In Legion Commander Race

Barring any unforeseen developments, Lyle O'Hara will be unopposed in his race for the position of Commander of Bert S. Crossland American Legion Post, James Wilko, chairman of the nominating committee, announced this week.

Competition for the other 1950-51 offices, according to Wilkes, will be stiff. Robert Sneath Jr. will be opposed by Ken Cunningham, a World War II veteran, in the campaign, for senior vice-commander.
