

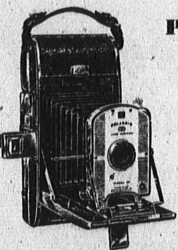

Delegates to the Asilmar Conference will join with delegates from the San Pedro Area Association tonight for a pot luck supper and a discussion on the YWCA as a preparation for attendance at the conference. Attending the conference will be delegates from New Mexico, Arizona and Hawaii as well as California. Ruth Lanman, San Pedro Y-Teen program director, will accompany the group.

Among activities being offered by the YWCA for any Torrance girl, are a number of week-long camping sessions at Tahquitz Meadows, registration and information about which are available at the Torrance YWCA Center, 1339 Post ave.

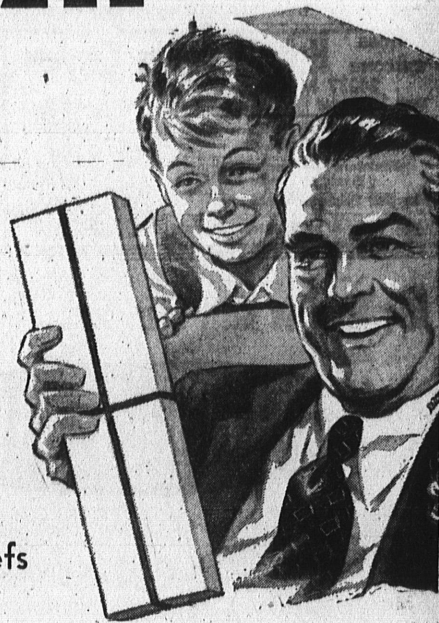
