### Seaside Students Visit Famous San Diego Zoo



Origin of the problem was bendonment of 105 feet on Origin of the problem was the abandonment, of 105 feet on the westerly side of the parkway, the land so vacated being given to the abuiting property owners. These owners. Bhe Hunting-ton-Redondo Company and the Sunhaven Corporation, say they cannot use the land because of a ruling by the city, attorney that the vacated property may be used only for street pur-poses. This unpaved strip of land constitutes a barrier to the use of the adjoining properties, the companies claim, in asking for a change of the zoning there.
