Mrs. Posten chose for her daughter's wedding a navy blue and white sheer dress with navy accessories. White carnations formed her corsage.

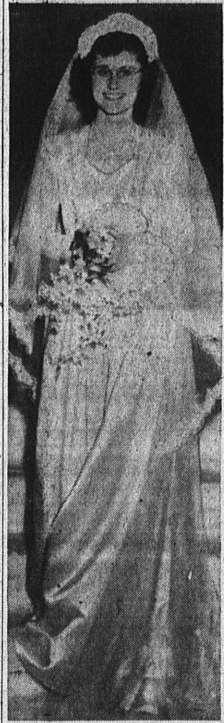
Mrs. N. D. Smith was attired in a beige floral print dress with white accessories. She also wore carnations.

White and purple asters banked at the base of a white parasol decorated the tea table and suggested the shower motif used throughout.

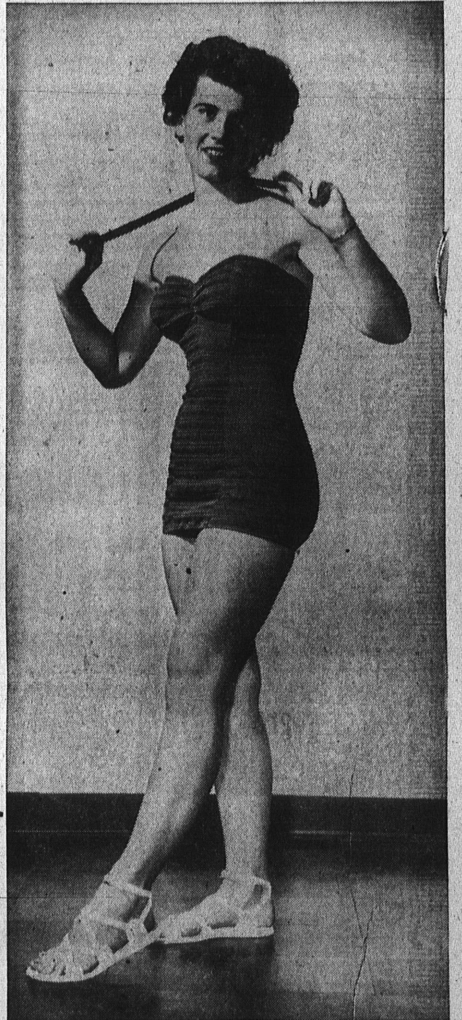
