A. E. Backman, representing Harbor City Chamber of Commerce, and Mrs. J. A. Hencel told the Monday gathering that halting Torrance buses from making their run through teir community would leave them stranded.

"It would isolate us completely." Backman said. "It affects not only us, but you as well," he said.

Quoting from a survey which he said was conducted by Mrs. Hencel, Backman said that two out of three families in the area were dependent in one way or another on the Torrance bus. SUPERINTENDENT DISAGREES

This contrasted sharply with the statement by Chamberlain. bus superintendent, that the line averaged about three passengers per trip except during school days when the children rode to and from school on the bus.

Chamberlain said the line, which was started early during world War II, had been a moneyloser for the past eight years. Mayor Bob Haggard, who was attending the meeting at the request of the merchants, told the Harbor City representatives that we had many people in Torrance who were farther from bus lines than Harbor City—and that the Torrance residents were supporting the buses with taxes.

"We should service our own people, even at a logs, before operating out-of-town lines at a loss," the Mayor said.

The meeting adjourned without reaching any conclusions, after Chairman John Almond told Backman and Mrs. Hencel that their only possible action would be to recommend to the council that the suspension of stopping the run Sunday are still in effect.
