Rev. England to Discuss God In Time of Crises

Rev. Cecil J. England will preach Sunday morning at 10:50 on the subject, "Does God Really Care?" This question has haunted men of religious faith in every age. The pre-supposition of the Christian faith is that God does care about what happens in human experience.

Otherwise faith is reduced to an intellectual conception of a coldly sublime creative power; worship and prayer, if they exist, shrink greatly in value; fellowship between God and Man is out of the question; the moral nature of God goes by the board; man is left without divine resources for conquering evil and for meeting the stresses and strains of everyday and thus practically all that has been known as religion flies out the window.

Our Christian-Hebrew tradition has refused to accept this result, though at times our faith in God's care is greatly shaken by the brutal facts of life. Rev. England wishes to show how our Christian Faith may be the only reliable source for hope, and faith, and courage to help us in times of great distress and mental turmoil.

under the ordinances, punishable by a maximum fine of \$500 and six months imprisonment, and registration lists would be open to constituted authorities only, it was said.

HITS SABOTEURS

The second ordinance follows the registration of the following types of individuals:

- (1) Those who advocate the overthrow of the United States, state or county government by force or violence; (2) Those who advocate sabotage for the purpose of interfering with the production of supplies for the armed forces or for civilian defense.

PROTECT GOVERNMENT

The third ordinance seeks the registration of individuals belonging to three types of organization. (1) An organization which advocates the control of government by a minority against the will of a majority; (2) An organization which advocates that if this compulsion is resisted by the majority by force, that the organization uses force or violence to impose its will upon the majority; and (3) An organization which advocates the principle that force is inevitable in accomplishing its desire for a change in government.
