In spite of a two-to-one Democratic registration, Republican Warren carried all but seven of Torrance's 34 precincts to best Jimmy Roosevett in the race for governor, 4389 to 2754—a margin of 1635 votes.
Turning out to vote in Tuesday's state-wide election, were 72 per cent of Torrance's 10,015 eligible voters. A total of 7233 persons marked ballots to establish an all-time high for the city.

Douglas. Nixon polled \$110 votes as against 2985 for Douglas. Only in the race for Attorney General did the power of the Democratic registration make itself known. Democratic Patterown nudged Edward S. Shattuck by a relatively close count of 3674 to 3030.


An analysis of the primary election figures and those of Tuesday's balloting indicates that Governor Warren gained considerable, strength between elections.
