

## Mobile X-Ray Units to Be Here Dec. 18-23; Visiting Plants Now

X-raying of chests in the Torrance area got under way this week in a preview action of the area-wide filming to begin here December 18.

Mobile units of the County X-ray Survey Foundation are this week visiting industrial plants in the area to enable employees to have their x-rays taken without charge.

Monday, the units were at National Supply, and yesterday they were operating at the International Derrick and Equipment Company. Tomorrow, they will visit the Pacific Electric shops here.

The big drive here will get under way a week from Monday when a fleet of the mobile units pull in to Torrance to spend six days filming residents

from 15 years of age and up.

A local committee, headed by Al Ewalt, has been busy preparing for the visit of the machine. Serving as co-chairman with Ewalt are Councilmen Willys G. Blount, representing North Torrance, and Councilman George Powell, representing Waverly.

Joe Helphand, of the Junior Chamber of Commerce, heads up the "locations committee." Other responsible figures for the turnout of various groups include Rev. C. J. England, Council of Churches; Dr. J. H. Hull, the schools; and Dr. Howard A. Wood, professional.

Mrs. A. G. Sauer will head the Women's Club committee for the hostesses, while Dr. Al Leitch Freyatt is handling the publicity.

The mobile x-ray machines will be set up in various locations about the area, and all residents of the city are being urged to avail themselves of the free service. The county-wide goal has been set at 100 per cent of all persons over 15 years of age.

## Metal Course Opens in Adult School
