Fire Chief Benner Gives Hints On How to Have Safe Christmas

Chief Benner said that many of these fires could have been prevented by a little forethought. And since more fires occur in the home than in any other place, special attention should be directed to fire hazayds around the house, especially now with Christmas trees and their flammable decorations.

"When planning your Christmas," the city's fire chief warns, "choose a safe location for the tree, away from any heat source and where it cannot fall and block a doorway."

He says to cut the base of the tree on an angle, stand it in a container of wet sand or water, brace it well and use only morflammable decorations. Flameproofed cotton and crepe paper, non-flammable plastics, itinsels and flameproofed tree are 'available and will reduce the fire hazard.
