The 1950 record figure shows an increase of receipts totaling \$18,325.32 over the 1949 total of \$150,603.00, according to Mrs. Conner.
For the final quarter of 1950—October, November, and December—the receipts totaled \$56,983.33 as compared to the total of \$49,851.55 for the same period in 1949.
