Healing Power of Truth Christian Science Topic

The healing power of Truth will be considered in the Sunday Lesson-Sermon in all Christian Science churches.

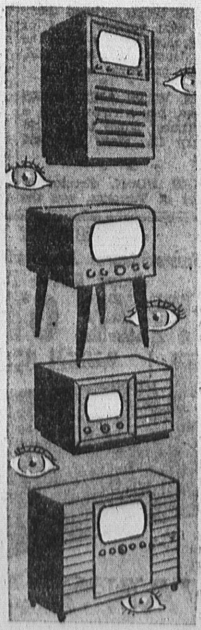
