(Continued from page 1) household and industrial chlorine products. They market their chlorine under the trade name of Sunny Sol. NO ODORS "Please point out that there is nothing hazardous or obnoxious about our operation in Torrance," Jones said. He pointed out that the plant here would be more of a bottling plant than anything. "We compound our products in the east," he said. Marketing of the Sunny Sol products here in the near future will mark the first time the product has been on sale on the West Coast. Jones said, although the company has been in business for 25 years. GROWTH MAPPED "Sometime in the future, we plan that the Torrance plant will employ 500 persons," the veterinary chemical manufacturer said. Besides the household products, the plant also manufactures chlorine for industrial use. Among these uses are dairy sterilizers, laundry bleaches, water purification, sewage disposal, and many industrial processes. The company also supplies the Army and Navy with chlorine. Lewis Jenkins and John W. Jones, Jr., are moving to Torrance from the Caledonia, N. Y., home offices of the company to assume management of the plant here, Jones said. The company has leased an acre of land on Border with an option to buy, Jones said.

Needed are cabinet makers, tile setters, painters, and carpenters according to Sam Levy, construction boss.

A choice of hours is offered any worker having skill in the aforementioned trades. In addition the men needed on the project may continue to hold down their regular jobs as Levy will arrange for the work to be done on Saturday and/or Sunday.

Making a plea for workers was Mrs. L. A. McCoy, of the Junior Woman's Club, sponsors of the project. Said Mrs. McCoy:

"The building is approximately 75 per cent complete but we cannot hope to meet the completion deadline, only five weeks away, unless we can obtain the services of those skilled workers needed by Mr. Levy."

Another inducement for applying for work at the local building project, Levy pointed out, was that no worker was subject to withholding tax.
