Not adventure but humanity is his interest and in his most recent work he has created a new hero, a young man of our own times, Charles Randall. A captain at 19 in World War I, and on leave from France, he meets and later marries Muriel, a modern Becky Sharp. She is a certain feminine type that comes to fine flower in war times. The picture of the tragedy and sequel that follows proves again the author's great ability as a novelist.

OWEN GLENN by Ben Ames Williams.

Owen Glenn is a novel of a growing up, the growing up of a boy into manhood, the emergence of a labor leader from back alleys to public importance; the development of a nation amid economic distress and world wars. However, it is Har-  
dison, Owen's town, that takes the center of the stage and symbolizes for us humanity's painful struggle to emerge from its own pits of greed and war to achieve its vision.

SON OF A HUNDRED KINGS by Thomas B. Costain.

One day in 1890 an English boy, shy and appealing, stepped off the boat at Halifax. Sewed to the back of his coat was an oilcloth sign "This is Ladar. Promise. He has no money, he is going to his father at Balfour, Ontario. Be kind to him." Son of a Hundred Kings is about the boy with the sign and the men and women for and against him as man and boy, he makes his handicapped way in the new world. A warm and moving story, with many fascinating characters, love interest and plenty of plot.
