WE HOPE THAT IT IS NOT TOO LATE FOR YOU TO TAKE EFFECTIVE ACTION TO BLOCK PROPOSED TAX INCREASE TO 25 PERCENT ON TELEVISION SETS STOP INCREASE IN TAX WOULD HURT INDUSTRY AND IS CAUSING IMMEDIATE SHORTAGE IN SOME MODELS PRIOR TO EFFECTIVE TAX DATE STOP YOUR HELP WILL BE APPRECIATED.
