New Waleria Sunday School Growing Weekly

The new Sunday School and church service which was started Easter Sunday at the clubhouse in Waleria Park, has an attendance of about 60 a week now, according to Rev. C. E. Miller, pastor of the sponsoring First Methodist Church.

Pastor, Wife Once Held By Japs in Philippines

Getting acquainted with members of his pastorate this week is Rev. H. G. Cassell, new minister of the Church of Christ, who spent 17 years in the Philippines, three of those years in a Japanese internment camp.

Rev. Cassell and his wife, Mrs. Marie Cassell who also spent 38 months interned in a Japanese camp, have moved to 1348 W. 216th street.

The new minister assumed his duties here April 22 to relieve Rev. Raymond Putman, who has been transferred to Indianapolis, Ind. His wife, Mayme, left yesterday by train to join her husband.

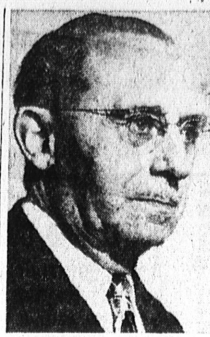
Rev. Cassell, Mrs. Cassell and two sons were interned by the Japanese on January 1, 1942, less than a month after Pearl Harbor.

They spent the next three years and two months in the Santo Tomas Internment Camp in Manila. On February 23, 1945 Philippine guerrillas led members of the U. S. 11th Airborne to the camp to liberate the Cassells and other prisoners. One of the sons now lives in South Gate and the other in Angola, Indiana.

Shortly after their evacuation on April 10, 1945, Rev. Cassell held a pastorate in Walla Walla, Washington and later at Cottage Grove, Oregon. For the past 18 months he has served as pastor of the Church of Christ at Ninth and Lime streets in Long Beach.

To start under his guidance on June 18 is a five-day-a-week Bible class to be held at the local church, 1217 Cravens avenue, during summer vacation.

Rev. Cassell revealed the school will be for students from kindergarten through the eighth grade.

Everlasting Punishment C.S. Sermon

The Lesson-Sermon on "Everlasting Punishment" in all Christian Science churches Sunday illustrates the need for turning from evil in order to be saved from its effects.

This counsel from Ezekiel (18:30) constitutes the Golden Text: "Repent, and turn yourselves from all your transgressions; so iniquity shall not be your ruin."

Scriptural selections include Jesus' parable of the lost sheep as given by Luke (15:4,5,7). "What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them, doth not leave the ninety and nine in wilderness, and go after that which is lost, until he find it? And when he hath found it, he layeth it on his shoulders, rejoicing. . . I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance."

"The purpose and motive to live aright can be gained now," declares Mary Baker Eddy in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures." She adds, "This point won, you started as you should. You have begun at the numeration-table of Christian Science, and nothing but wrong intention can hinder your advancement" (p. 326).
