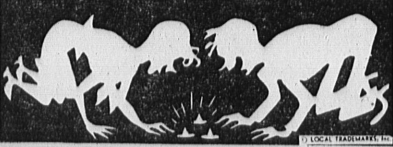
## Yardage Store Opens Saturday

The store will be located at 2431 Compton boulevard, two blocks east of Crenshaw boulevard.

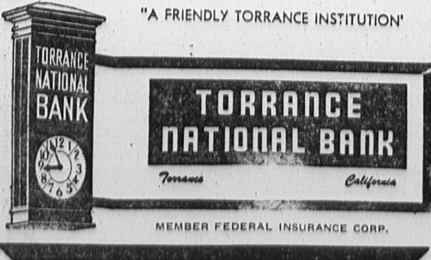

The Ryckman family had a few days away from home. Emmett went fishing and Grayce and Judy visited friends in Ojai.

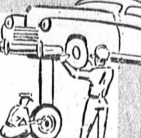
Albert "Bill" Weber is mighty proud these days. His brother-in-law, Phillip Hawks just recently received the Bronze Star from Vice Admiral Struble.
