## Mrs. Leitner Doubly Feted On Birthday

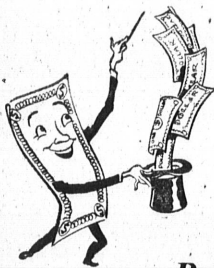
