The festival at El Camino will be part of "Senior Day" on the junior college campus. Represented in the festival will be Inglewood, Leuzinger, El Segundo, Redondo, Washington and Torrance.

All but one of the cast are up for membership in the National Thespian Society—an honorary society for meritorious achievement in dramatic arts.

The purpose of El Camino's festival tomorrow is to stimulate interest in educational theater and to promote better relations among the surrounding high schools and the junior college.

Production of the plays is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. Following the plays the El Camino Theater Arts Club will host the visiting dramatists at a banquet in the Campus Center. Kenneth McGowan, head of the UCLA drama department, will be the speaker. Criticism will be offered by Irving Pichel, motion picture director; Florence Bates, character actress, and Kenn Carpenter, head of Los Angeles City College drama department.

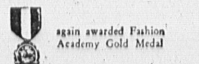


