Completion of negotiations for the purchase of a three-acre site for the new First Chrisian Church to be located at Eldorado street and Maple avenue was announced this week by Rev. Ceel J. England, pastor.

The cash deal involved more than \$20,000, according to Rev. England, and ended nego-that ing for the past two years.

The object of relocating is to make the church a neighborhood of the city where there is no other church. When the present

When the present construction program is completed in Torranee Gardens there will be over 800 new homes, all of which will be in the immediate neighborhood of the new church location. By the time these homes are occupied there will be approximately an addition of more than 2500 people to the population of the city.
