## Cake Decorating Class Held in North Torrance

A free class, open to all adults regardless of residence, in cake decorating and pastry designing, is held each Tuesday night in room 112 of Torrance High School and each Thursday night at the North Torrance Elementary School, four blocks east of Crenshaw boulevard and 174th street.

Both beginning and advanced students learn the basic rules of cake decoration: making of flowers, little animals, landscape and home scenes designed to grace cakes for all occasions.

## Harbor Hospital Head Assumes Duties in L.A.

J. E. Smits, director of Harbor General Hospital here for the past six years, was named administrator of Childrens Hospital in Los Angeles this week, according to an announcement by Edgar C. Hummel, president of the Childrens Hospital Society.

Replacing Smits at Harbor General will be Alfred L. Thomas, according to County Superintendent of Charities Arthur J. Will. Thomas has taken over on a temporary basis pending Civil Service examinations.

Smits has been associated with County General Hospital for the past 14 years. Before coming to Harbor General in 1946, he served as personnel director, procurement manager, and assistant of the County General. He staffed and equipped the hospital here when it was taken over by the county following the war. He assumed his new duties at Childrens Hospital Monday.

Thomas, who took over at Harbor Monday, has been assistant director of the county's Olive View Sanatorium. He has been in county service since 1930, and is a former director of research for the Charities Department.
