

Campus Hails New CIF Sprint Champ

Hats of Tartarville citizens were off this week to Bullet Bob Brow, who missed by one-tenth of a second tying the CIF record while winning the Cee 180-yard dash in the finals at Long Beach last Saturday.

For the fourth time this year, the Tartar freshman lowered the boom on the school mark for the event, running the distance Saturday in 18.5 seconds. The CIF record is 18.4 seconds.

TOPS LOOP RECORD

His race beats the Bay League record of 18.9, but it will not set a new league mark as the meet wasn't a league meet.

Pushing Brow to the finish line was Carter of Pomona, who finished less than a yard behind the Torrance flash. Jordan of Long Beach Wilson was third and Ellis of Monrovia was fourth in front of Bill Rafitis of Mira Costa.

STARTS EARLY

Brow first set a new school mark in the 180 when he ran the distance in 19.2 seconds at Excelsior early in the season. The previous record had been 19.6 seconds set by Harry Bayless last year.

At the CIF quarterfinals in Carpinteria he ran the distance in 18.9, he lowered that to 18.7

at the semi-finals in Bell Gardens, and in the finals did 18.5.

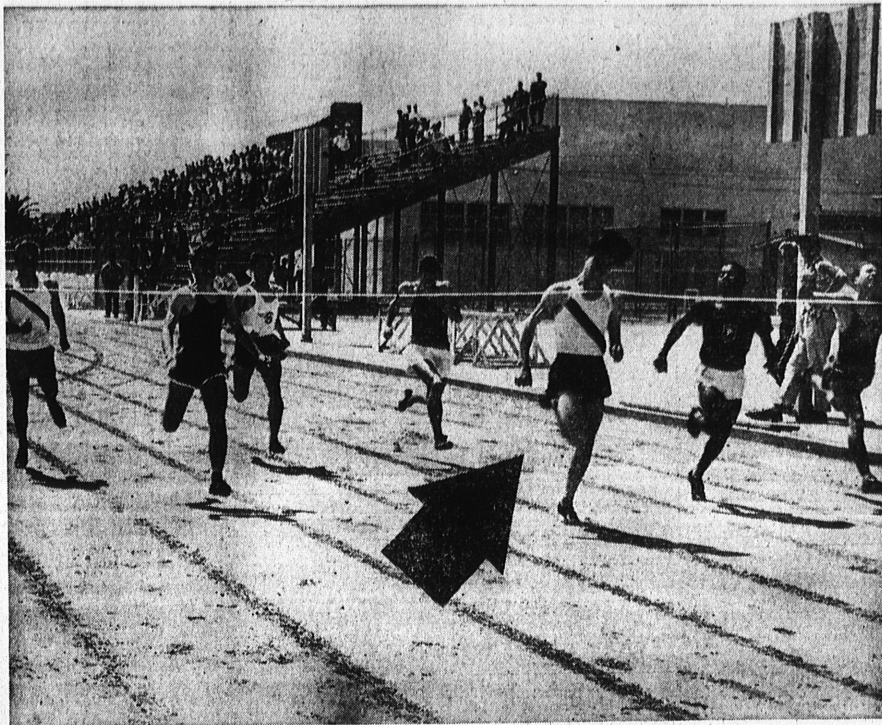
Brow, a 15-year-old freshman, has great natural running ability, according to all the track coaches who have seen him run. With hard work and training, he could be one of tomorrow's stars.

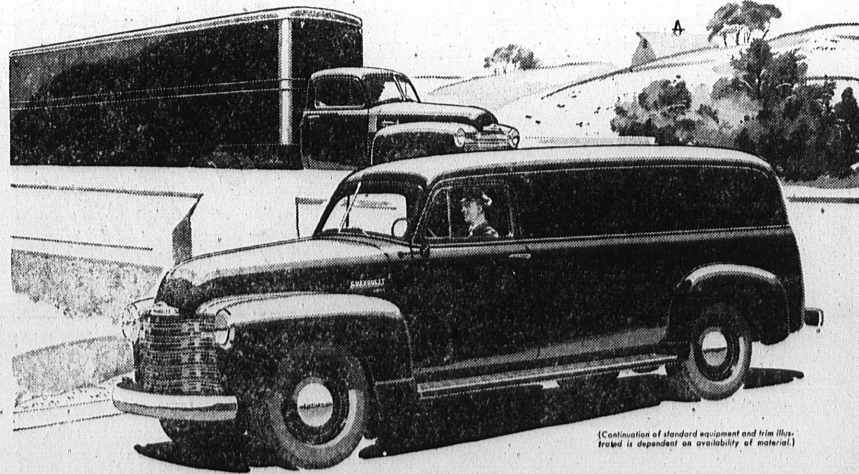

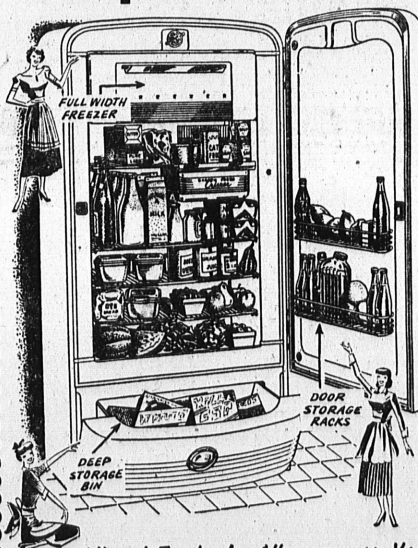
