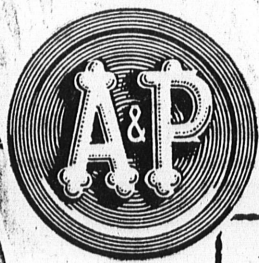

Rev. England Tells Sunday Sermon Topic

Rev. Cecil England, pastor of the Torrance First Christian Church, will preach on the subject "Rethinking Our Salvation" at the 10:50 morning service on Sunday, June 10.

He will discuss three important elements of the traditional attitude of Salvation and Redemption.

"There has been a traditional idea that to be saved is to be saved from evil or sin; this has been taken to mean a rather vague and general idea. It would be similar to say that one is immunized from disease. To be saved from disease to make sense has to be a specific disease, not disease in general. And so it is about being saved in general. For salvation to have a vital meaning it must be of necessity mean salvation from specific sins and evils," Rev. England points out.

God as Creator Stressed in Sunday Sermon

The perfection and eternity of all that God has made is stressed in the Sunday Lesson-Sermon on the subject "God the Only Cause and Creator" in all Christian Science churches.

This citation from Revelation (15:3) is the Golden Text: "Great and Marvellous are thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are thy ways, thou King of saints."

In a Bible Lesson passage Jeremiah declares, "The Lord is the true God, he is the living God, and an everlasting king: . . . He hath made the earth by his power, he hath established the world by his wisdom, and hath stretched out the heavens by his discretion" (10:10, 12).

"There is but one creator and one creation," declares Mary Baker Eddy in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures." Again she says, "Deity was satisfied with His work. How could He be otherwise, since the spiritual creation was the outgrowth, the emanation, of
