Sunday Sermon Topic Announced

God's power and willingness to deliver and sustain man will be considered in the Sunday lesson-sermon on the subject "God the Preserver of Man," in all Christian Science churches.
This declaration of Paul from 11 Timothy (4:18) constitutes the Golden Text: "The Lord shall deliver me from every evil work, and will preserve me unto His heavenly kingdom."
Bible selections from the Psalms: "The Lord is the portion of mine inheritance and of my cup; thou maintainest my lot. The lines are fallen unto me in pleasant places; yea, I have a goodly heritage. It is God that girdeth me with strength, and maketh my way perfect" (16:5, 6 and 18:32).
In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," Mary Baker Eddy points out, "The divine Mind that made man maintains His own image and likeness." Again she says, "Man is not made to till the soil. His birthright is dominion, not subjection. He is lord of the belief in earth and heaven; himself subordinate along to his Maker" (pgs. 151, 517).
