

Rev. Schauer to Preach Final Sermon Here Sunday

Rev. Ulysses S. Schauer, pastor of the Central Evangelical United Brethren Church of Torrance, will deliver his final sermon Sunday in the local church before accepting the pastorate of the Christ Community Church at 135th street and Vermont avenue.

Rev. Schauer received his assignment to the new church during the annual conference of the church held in Santa Ana last week. His primary task on his new assignment will be building of the congregation of the one-year-old edifice. This is the same church in which Rev. Wesley Roloff, who was Rev. Schauer's predecessor here, did preparatory work three years ago.

The local pastor came here two years ago and took up residence at 1543 Marceling avenue. He and Mrs. Schauer plan to move about June 28, he said.

Rev. Schauer will be succeeded by Rev. Homer H. Miller, who comes to Torrance from the Woodruff Memorial Evangelical United Brethren Church of Stockton, California. The new pastor will open his ministry here on July 1.

During his stay in Torrance Rev. Schauer was active in the Torrance Council of Churches and took an active part in Lions Club activities.

His sermon topic for his final lecture will be "Jesus of Nazareth, Passes By." The service starts at 11 a.m.

Atomic Force Is Christian Science Topic

The fact that God is mightier than all material forces is emphasized in the Sunday lesson sermon in all Christian Science churches on the subject "Is the Universe, Including Man, Evolved by Atomic Force?"

The golden text is from Revelation (11:17): "We give Thee thanks, O Lord God Almighty, which art, and wast, and art to come; because Thou hast taken to Thee Thy great power, and hast reigned."

Scriptural citations include this verse from Amos: "He that formeth the mountains and creteth the wind, and declareth unto man what is His thought, that maketh the morning darkness, and treadeth upon the high places of the earth, the Lord, the God of hosts, is His name" (4:13).

"God creates and governs the universe, including man," declares Mary Baker Eddy in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures." Again she points out, "Spirit, God, is infinite, all Spirit can have no opposite" (pgs. 295, 278).

Missionaries To Show Movies Of Far East

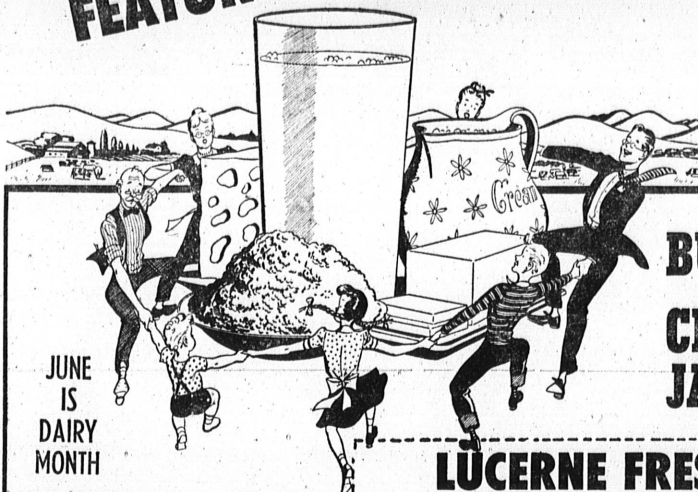
