for a continuation of all services at the present or expanded levels. Original budget requests from Departments have been adjusted to meet the estimated income for the year. Departmental services and activities have been maintained in proper balance for our growing community. Any increase in services or cost beyond those indicated will necessitate an increase in the tax rate or the securing of revenues from some new service charge or fee.  
"The proposed budget provides for the retention of \$20 per month cost-of-living adjustment by those employees who now receive the same, and an additional \$10 per month adjustment for all employees in the classified service. Salaries account for approximately seventy per cent of the operating budget.  
"This is a balanced budget. All operating costs are covered by the estimated current income for the coming year. In keeping with the established policy, cash surplus will be used as reserve funds and for a Public Works and Capital Outlay Program."
