Waiting for him with his mother when he arrives will be his wife and two children, one of whom the sergeant has never seen.

Sergeant Middleton, a Marine regular for the past 10 years, was due to return to San Francisco last evening aboard the transport General William F. Hase.

Before going to Korea last July, he was stationed for two years at the El Toro Marine Base, his mother said yesterday.

His wife, Frances, and his daughter, Janet S. and son, Clyde E. Jr., 4 months, arrived here from Georgia yesterday to meet him when he returns to Torrance. It will be the first meeting between the father and his young son.
