The bids were referred to the city manager and city engineer for a recommendation at the meeting to be held on July 10.

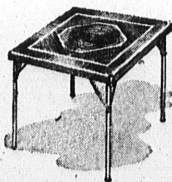

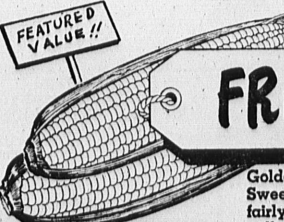
