DEAR DAD, MOM and SIS: You must have been dis-guasted with me; a larg, use-less, brainless kid. Dad, you tried so hard to make me a good Sunday School student; I played. I chose the wrong associates; re me mb er the time I invited Tom to go with us on a Sunday School plenie? Sis eried, was ashamed. Mom was furious as she said, "He's tough, a petty gangster. You must not associate with him." Now Im a soldier in Korea and found another Tom.
