

Banning Principal Named Community Chest Chairman

The Harbor Area in the fall Community Chest campaign will have as its chairman, Noble Waite, principal of Wilmington's Banning High School. It is announced by Lloyd L. Austin, chairman of the Chest's Department of Associated Cities.

Waite succeeds Sam Levy of Torrance, who as area chairman in the 1950 Red Feather campaign directed volunteers who raised 97 per cent of their \$100,000 goal for funds to support the Chest's 160 health and welfare services and the USO.

More than 2800 volunteers will be needed to raise funds during the Red Feather appeal, October 16-November 15, in Torrance, Lomita, Gardena, Rolling Hills, Palos Verdes, San Pedro, Wilmington, Harbor City and Dominguez. Each community's campaign will be directed by a local chairman with the cooperation of local volunteers.

Waite said that emphasis will be placed on gearing all campaign plans to speed as well as efficiency. Early organization of volunteers permits enrollment of outstanding leaders, he stated, and response to the first call for men and women to fill key positions has been excellent. Waite is a long-time volunteer.

In Red Feather appeals and in planning for community health and welfare needs. In 1950, he was city chairman for the campaign in Wilmington, which benefited the 100 per cent level.
