The ex-Torrance High School student is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Julius N. Curtis.

Corp. Curtis was first wounded on March 23 when he was hit by flying shrapnel while dragging a wounded buddy into a foxhole. He had leaped from the relative safety of his own foxhole to aid his buddy when he was hit.

On June 13 he was wounded again while fighting 20 miles above the border between North and South Korea. He is on the mend in a hospital some 28 miles inside South Korea.
