Crecelius is married and lives in Monrovia at the present time. He said he plans to move to Torrance in the near future.

IN PASADENA

During the past four years, the new principal has been

teaching in the Pasadena City School system. Before that, he taught at Charter Oak near Covina. Mrs. Crecelius has been a teacher in the Pasadena schools for the past six years, he told a Herald reporter this week.

Crecelius received his bachelor of science in education at the Wisconsin Teachers College. All of his graduate work has been done at SC, he said. He plans to complete work for his master's degree in education next summer. He is a member of Phi Delta Kappa, national educational fraternity.

WAS OVERSEAS

During the war he was a Link Trainer Instructor with the Air Force and spent 14 months in India with the Army Transport Command, the unit that was flying the "hump" into China.

He was an instructor during that time, Crecelius said, but he flew a mission over the arduous Asiatic mountains "just out of curiosity."

The 30-year-old teacher has been coming to Torrance once a week since his selection for the principalship to get acquainted with the situation, he said.

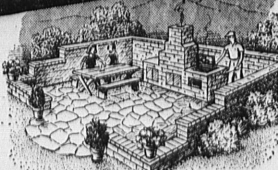
