

## Nurses Awarded \$10,000 to Aid in State Nursing Survey

Recognition of the scope and importance of the nursing studies program launched last March by the California State Nurses' Association has resulted in a \$10,000 grant from the American Nurses' Association. Mrs. Margaret Feuille, president of Harbor Area District Nurses' Association, announced yesterday.

The \$10,000 grant, the national association informed CSNA executives, was the first awarded to any of the 48 state associations.

The California nursing study, approved by a Citizens' Advisory Committee of 26 and guided by a smaller Technical Committee

of experts, is designed to determine current nursing practice of professional nurses, and auxiliary workers.

This study, to be conducted among a sample of California hospitals, should reflect conditions under every routine circumstance. Mrs. Margaret Feuille pointed out. The results are ex-

pected to provide data for making recommendations as to proper distribution of functions among all types of nursing personnel.

"The long-range purpose of the nursing studies program is to provide improved patient care through better utilization of our nurse power," Mrs. Margaret


