Cole Signs Idaho Football Contract

Former Tartar Grid Coach Eddie Cole said this week he has signed a two-year contract with Idaho College as varsity football coach and head of the athletic department.

The former coach here at Torrance High School from 1946 until this year said that two local boys were "going with me" to play ball at the Liberal Arts College. The two planning to enroll at Idaho are Boyd Crawford, a letterman at El Camino last year and brainy quarterback at the varsity at Torrance the year before, and Wendell Vaughn, an All-Bay League end on the 1949 Tartar varsity.

Two other well-known local grid stars may also make the trip with him, but as yet have not been able to complete the arrangements, the coach said.

Going up to "look the place over" today are three other local grid names: Dick Turner, former THS co-captain and last year's El Camino fullback; Aramis "Ironman" Dandoy of last year's Torrance varsity and Don Young, El Camino quarterback and baseball pitcher.

In addition to football, Cole will coach boxing and track. He starts September 1.

The college has an enrollment of 700 students.

On the Idaho schedule are some nice trips the new coach will make, including one to Honolulu to play the University of Hawaii. Idaho will also meet San Francisco State, Lewis and Clark University, Eastern Ore-

Triple Bill August 19

Calculating the competition would be keener with some of the obviously weaker teams eliminated, the baseball committee of the coming Municipal Hardball Championship Tournament of Southern California this week rescheduled the tournament to make it an eight-team double elimination tournament.

Entered in the tournament, which will start August 19, are eight of the strongest municipal teams in Southern California.

The tournament will open with a double-header in the afternoon and another game scheduled for under the lights later the same day. There is no admission for

any of the games.

Early predictions put Torrance's own Bluebirds as a top contender for the title. They won the first round of the tough Long Beach Municipal League and are currently leading the second round of play.

The locals are assured of no breeze, however. Some of the competition facing them includes the Upland-Ontario Pirates, the North American Mustangs and the Glendale Legion Dons—all of which are leading their respective leagues.

Other squads in the tourney are the Long Beach Oceanview, who are tied with the Hod Carriers of San Pedro for second place in the Long Beach municipal league. The Hod Carriers are also entered.

The closing date of the tournament will be August 31, according to Frank Carpenter, director of recreation for the City of Torrance.
