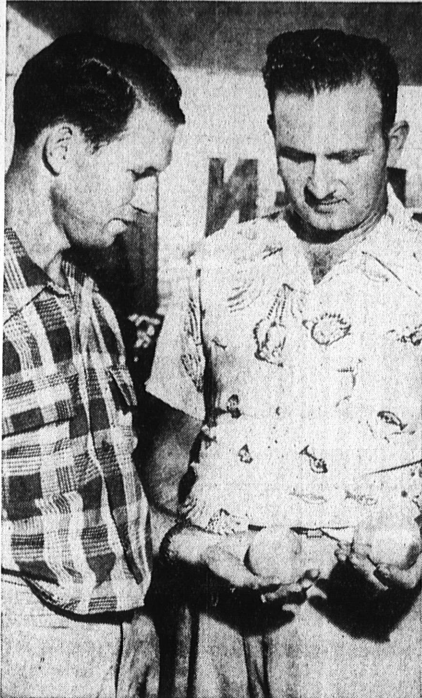

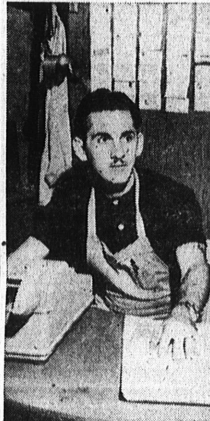

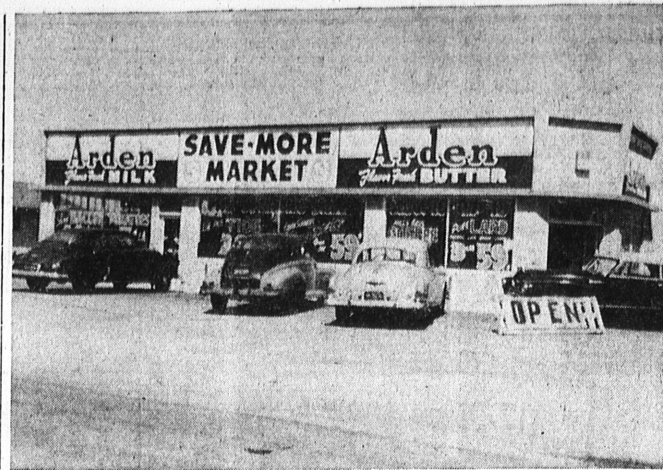

... Grand Opening Stated for Weekend

New Market Slates Opening Over Week-End

Scheduling a grand opening for their new market at 182nd street and Prairie avenue today, tomorrow and Saturday are two young veterans of the grocery and produce business, Andrew Dulgarian and Jack Ballard.

The new store, which boasts 3600 square feet of floor space, will be managed by Chuck Barber, another young veteran of the grocery business.

To celebrate the official opening, the two young businessmen plan to give away 10 baskets of groceries during the evening next Saturday, they said. Featured at the new market will be leading brands of canned goods, meats and household supplies. The store will also carry lines of light hardware and kitchen supplies, according to Barber.

Luer's ready-sliced meats are featured in the self-service delicatessen counter along with other packaged goods ranging from cheeses to tortillas. Two butchers are behind the meat counters to serve customers. Vernon Brick is the meat department manager.

The two owners are at present the operators of the produce departments of two other stores in the North Torrance-Lawndale area, they said. Dulgarian has been in business for himself since 1941, he said.

The store will be open daily except Sunday.
