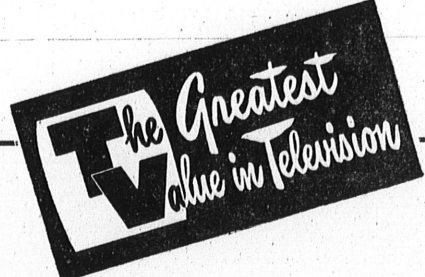
Joins Ranks of Graduate Nurses at Santa Barbara
