Steel Executive Addresses Local Management Club

A period of tremendous industrial expansion still lies ahead for the west coast region, according to Charles L. Hamman, general sales staff manager of the Columbia Steel Company, who was the featured speaker at a recent meeting of the Palos Verdes County Club, Hamman based his prediction upon the production of the steel industry during the past ten years. The total tonnage of steel consumed in the coastal region in 1941, according to the speaker, was approximately 2 and one-half million tons. 27 per cent of which was manufactured in the west coast. The amount used last year was slightly in excess of 5 million tons with 61 per cent of this total manufactured in the coastal area.
