Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts and Explorers (teenage Scouts) of Torrance will participate in the observance of Fire Prevention Week, October 7-13, according to Preston Roberts, activities chairman for Harbor Scout district, which includes the community.

Troop meeting programs will emphasize fire prevention and the requirements for the fireman's merit badge will be reviewed, Roberts explained. Units will hold fire drills and inspections and clean-ups to remove fire hazards from meeting places.
