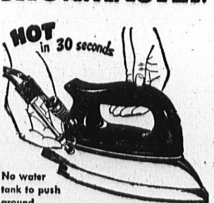
Groups of members and their husbands from Redondo Beach and Gardena, as well as those from Torrance and Long Beach, were among the guests.
