

EL CAMINO COLLEGE TO HOLD OPEN HOUSE

Residents of the El Camino College district will be able to see and inspect college facilities at an open house to be held Sunday, October 28, from 3 to 5 p.m.

The school has announced that in addition to the new administration building which was put into use this semester, visitors will be shown the new social studies building, the cosmetology building and the Campus Center building.

Students and faculty members will be on hand for the open house ceremonies to greet visitors and conduct tours through the various buildings on campus.

Refreshments will be served in the Campus Center, which houses the student lounge, bookstore, soda fountain and cafeteria.

El Camino has a new peak enrollment this year, with 4400 students attending the college. Building plans are being made for a potential of 10,000 enrollment.

A new life science building is now under construction, and approval is being sought for construction of a combination library and classroom building, according to Carl G. Arfwedson, college business director.

Wage Report Deadline Near

Deadline for filing California unemployment insurance wage reports and contribution returns for the third quarter of the year is Wednesday, October 31, E. L. Funder, auditor in charge for the State Department of Employment in Long Beach said this week.

"I want to remind employers that reporting requirements under the California Unemployment Insurance Act have not been changed, and that contributions by both employers and wage earners should be made on the first \$3000 of wages paid to an individual by each employer during a calendar year."

Funder suggested that employers call the office by phone before contacting the office in person because the Audit District Office is scheduled to move to the new building at Anaheim and Pine during the month of October.

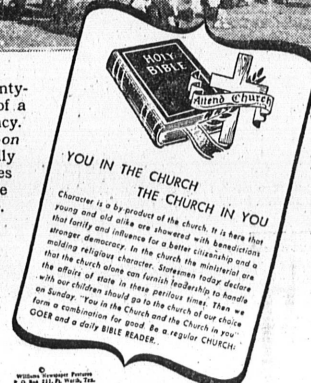

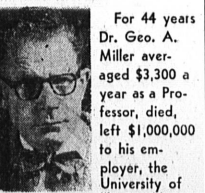
