

TOR-LOMS SET HOT PACE IN 3-A LOOP

League-leading Torrance-Lomita, rapidly shaping up as one of the top semi-pro clubs ever to come out of this area, put their unbeaten record on the block Sunday against the Los Angeles Senators at Torrance Park. Game time is 2 p.m.

The local club now has won three straight contests and is now riding high atop the Triple A League ladder.

Led by clutch-hitting Hal Jackson, the Tor-Loms disposed of some of their toughest opposition in record time Sunday as they defeated a 20th Century Fox nine, 3-1.

It was believed to be the fastest game ever played in Torrance Park at 1 hour, 33 minutes, total elapsed time.

Hal Jackson socked out a two-bagger in the first inning for the winning Tor-Lom margin. Scoring were Bill Johnson and Lou Egan. Johnson and Eddie Roberts led the

Tor-Lom artillery, with two hits apiece.

However, the game was pitchers' battle between superb Herm Besse of the Tor-Loms and Elen Cox of 20th Century-Fox. Besse twirled seven scoreless innings and allowed only three hits. Cox went the route, holding the vaunted Tor-Loms to seven safe blows.
