Sermon Topic Is Adam and Fallen Man

The perfection and majesty of God's creation is contrasted with the dream of mortal existence in the Sunday Lesson-Sermon on "Adam and Fallen Man" in all Christian Science churches. One of Paul's declarations in his letter to the Ephesians is the Golden Text: "Ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord; walk as children of light, . . . proving what is acceptable unto the Lord" (5:8, 10).

In a Scriptural passage Jude writes, "Now unto him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy. To the only wise God our Savior, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever" (1: 24, 25).

On this subject Mary Baker Eddy says in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "The great truth in the Science of being, that the real man was, is, and ever shall be perfect, is incontrovertible; for if man is the image, reflection, of God, he is neither inverted nor subverted, but upright and Godlike" (p. 200).
