## Darby Outlines Plan to Improve Area Highways

Crenshaw boulevard is rapidly  
becoming one of Los Angeles  
County's most important travel  
routes because of the rapid  
growth of adjacent cities in the  
Harbor area. Supervisor  
Raymond V. Darby told the  
Harbor District Chamber of  
Commerce last Friday night.

Speaking on the progress in  
improving travel routes in the  
Harbor area, Darby said that  
Crenshaw boulevard and the  
yet-to-be-built Harbor Freeway  
are of top importance as far  
as expenditures on north-south  
arteries are concerned.

Eventual plans for Crenshaw  
call for the boulevard to run  
through Rolling Hills to the  
ocean. Some widening and pav-  
ing of the road already have  
been done in the Torrance area,  
with more in the offing.

Other major expenditures for  
improvements are earmarked for  
Normandie avenue, Western av-  
enue, and Sepulveda boulevard,  
Darby told Chamber members.

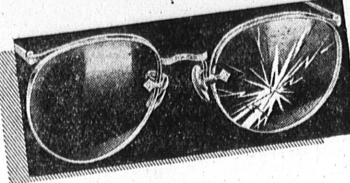

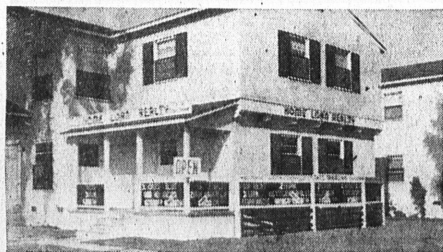
