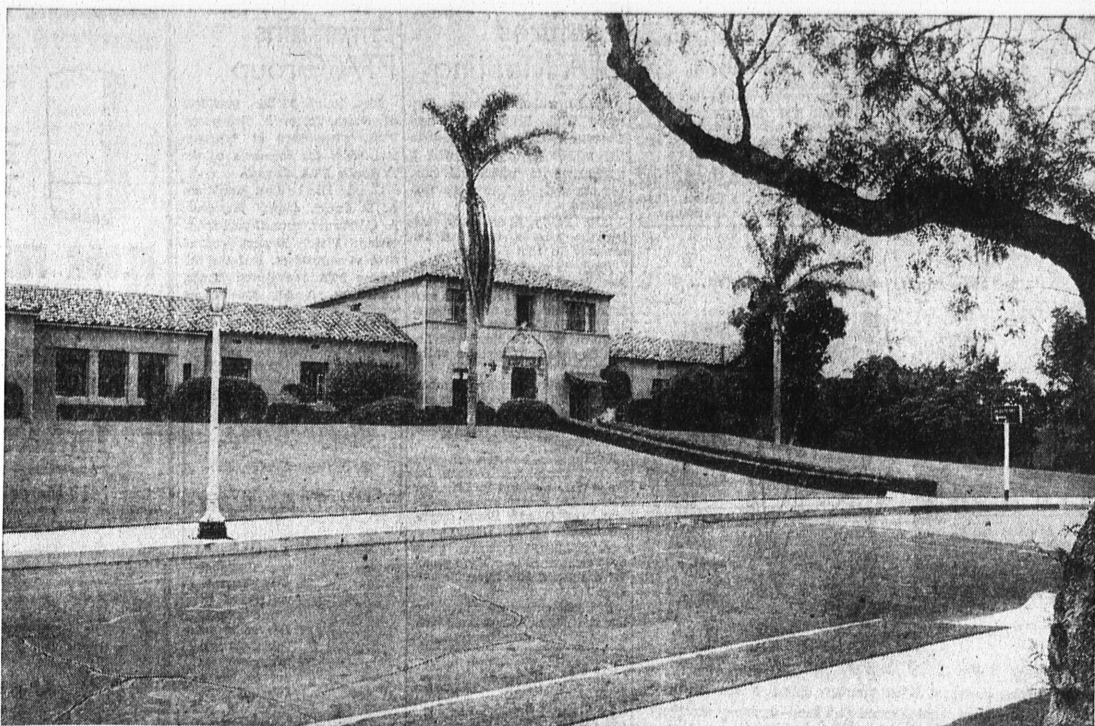
"Purpose of the Women's Auxiliary will be to raise funds and contribute personal services by its members. However, only such equipment and service will be supplied as is recommended by the hospital governing board. We will supply the funds and the hospital management will make the purchases. Miss Elsa Hammerstrom, hospital superintendent, will act as liaison officer between the hospital board of directors and the Women's Auxiliary.

"As the hospital serves not only Torrance but the South Bay cities of Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, as well as Gardena and Lomita, it is hoped to enlarge the membership of the auxiliary to over 150 women," Mrs. Smith stated.

Pouring at the tea, Friday afternoon were Mrs. Dorothy Jamieson and Mrs. Helen Miller, both members of the governing board; Mrs. J. S. Lancaster, whose husband, the late Dr. J. S. Lancaster, was the first president of the board, and Mrs. Norman A. Leake, wife of Dr. Leake, who was the first medical doctor to establish his office in Torrance in 1912. There were only two other families in Torrance when he came here, Dr. Leake recalls. He is still residing at 1625 Marcelina avenue, but has retired from active practice.
