Santa Visits Longren Plant For Bonus Party

Christmas comes but once a year—for most folks, that is. Out at the Longren Aircraft plant, however, Santa slips down the chimney at least four times a year with goodies in the way of bonus checks for everybody in the plant.

Latest of the off-season Christmas parties was held there recently when the company divided nearly \$10,000 in profits with the employees of the company.

Taking the part of Santa Claus was Al Sarada, of the shipping department, who donned a set of snowy whiskers and a red suit and distributed checks averaging about \$100 to employees as their share of the profits of the company during the preceding quarter.

Employees of the firm get 24 per cent of the profits, according to Hampden Wentworth, vice president of the company. "Our slogan of 'The Best Place in the Country to Work' is borne out by the fact that we have a considerable waiting list of applicants who want to go to work in our plant," Wentworth said.

The bonus parties are no different than any other Christmas party, regardless of the time of year, one spokesman said. "We have a Christmas tree, exchange gifts—usually eggs—and Christmas carols are piped through the public address system all day long," said Les Alkman, assistant to Wentworth.

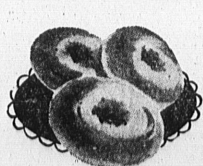
