Korea Veteran Visiting Aunt While on Leave

Visiting his aunt here after spending nearly 16 months in Korea is 21-year-old Cpl. Henry E. McCawley, a member of the 21st Ordnance M. M. Company.

Corporal McCawley is visiting Mrs. Robert W. Elliott at 1457 West 228th street.

The Korea veteran first went overseas in January, 1949. He was stationed at Kysto, Japan, until June, 1950, at which time he was sent to Korea.
