

## Warning Lights On Highway Get Board Approval

Petitioners for yellow warning blinkers on Pacific Coast Highway before the entrances to Seaside Ranchos and Hollywood Riviera received the support of the Board of Education last week when the board voted to send a letter to the Department of Public Works recommending the safety measures.

Specifically, residents of Seaside and the Riviera have sought to have yellow warning blinkers installed before Roberts' road and Pasco de Gracia along the highway.

The board of education considered the matter seriously, because school busses leaving and entering the areas from Pacific Coast Highway have difficulty with the high speed traffic in the area.

The matter was brought to the attention of the members by Judge John A. Shidler, president of the board.
