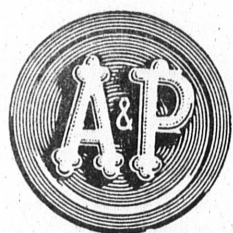

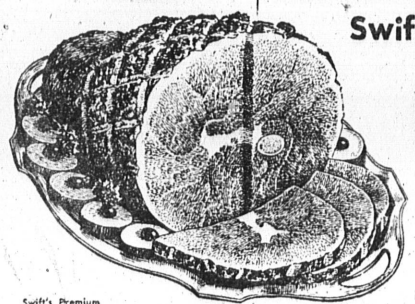

## Home Gardening Course to Open

A practical and personal course in home gardening and landscaping with instruction in planting roses, fruit and citrus trees, and tips on pest control, fertilization, and plant foods will be held each Tuesday evening at the Torrance High School starting December 11, it was announced here this week.

Designed for home owners with little or no background in gardening, the course should be especially helpful to the owners of new homes in the area, according to Donald Manashaw, director of the Adult School of Education.

The class will meet at 7 p.m. each Tuesday, and admittance is free to any adult. Those interested may register for the course by attending the class.

Instructor of the class will be Loring L. Bigelow, state director of the California Association of Nurserymen and president of the Continella chapter of the association. He is a licensed landscape contractor in the state and is widely known as a rose specialist.

The subject of soils in the new home tracts around the area will be given special attention, Manashaw said.
