At the front will be three animated figures, a boy, a girl and a dog. Carnations, sweet peas, orchids, chrysanthemums and roses will be used in creating the floral atmosphere. At the rear, will be a tall cathedral. The idea is young children looking forward to their dreams of the future; theme of the 1952 parade.
