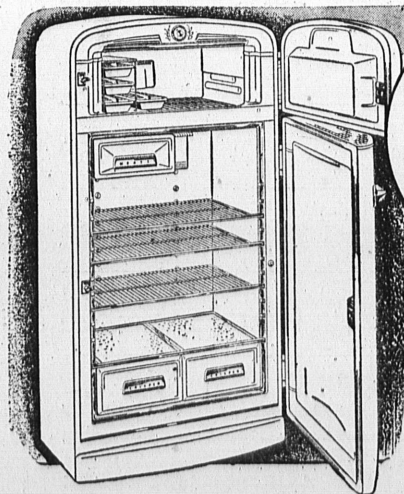

Unlawful for Child to Own Firearms

Timely advice to fond parents who may have been contemplating the purchase of a BB gun for junior's Christmas present, was given by Officer S. W. Stevenson of the Traffic Education Section of the Los Angeles Police Department at the Safety Conference of Tenth District California Congress of Parents and Teachers. Such guns, as well as those which shoot pellets, are illegal, under the law which prohibits ownership of firearms under the age of twenty-one years. In the hands of irresponsible youngsters, the deadly missiles have been used to break windows, street lights and even blind others.

Two-wheel bikes should not be given to a child either, until he is big enough in stature to properly reach the pedals, and old enough to grasp the motor vehicle rules. Parents can be liable for damage done by bike riders.

Cecil Zaun, director of safety education for the Board of Education and a member of the National Safety Council, scored parents who double park around the schools creating one of our greatest safety hazards. He also pointed out the dangers of parents who drive small children to school on rainy days and drop them off in the middle of the block on the wrong side of the street.
